Out of the Rough

April is upon us and so begins another golf season. I am very excited and in spite of some historically dry weather last year the golf course is breaking dormancy better than I've seen it since the spring of 2013. Let's hope the trend continues!

Greens have been aerified and are healing nicely. We applied a heavy coat of topdressing sand this spring to help correct some deficiencies in the top portion of our greens mix. The topdressing procedures have taken longer than expected due to a constant stream of storms passing over the course in March. Sand topdressing procedures are performed best when dry so we've had to dodge some weather to complete them properly. I appreciate everyone's patience and compliments these last few days and weeks.

Speaking of the weather, we have received 4.54" of rain in March. While this will work out to be slightly below average, we received precipitation on 15 of the 31 days of the month. Whew!!! This has kept the course in a saturated state and lead to countless cart restrictions. Again, I appreciate everyone's understanding that we must first and foremost protect our turf, particularly during times like this when growth and recovery is virtually non-existent.

On March 23rd we had some fairly significant wind damage on the course. We lost 2 pine trees and 1 oak tree in those storms. The removal of each of these trees will enhance the growing environments of the 6th and 10th greens complexes. A 4th tree, that was collateral damage of the fallen oak on the 10th, will be removed as time permits.



A cold snap in the middle of March warranted covering several approach areas with turf blankets to protect newly emerged Bermuda and Zoysia grass. This was a big success as you can see in the picture. The turf on the left was exposed, while the turf on the right was protected. The blankets are certainly an inconvenience for golf but the photo clearly shows its merit.

Social Members Golf Policy adopted by BOD 3/22/17

With the golf season upon us, the Signal Mountain Golf & Country Club Board of Directors has thoroughly considered what golf privileges, if any, should apply to Social Members. The Board has researched what other private clubs in our area provide and are confident our policy is in line, if not more generous, than other clubs. Being as we are, first and foremost, a golf club, the following policy has been adopted to go into effect April 1, 2017.

- 1. Social members are limited to one round per month with a maximum of 6 rounds per year. Regular green fees and cart fees apply. A round is considered to consist of 18 holes per membership and applies to the membership only, and not the number of household members. Social members using this privilege are not required to play with a golf member.
- 2. Social members may play during the week (Tuesday through Friday) at times available by the Pro Shop and which does not interfere with any club scheduled events.
- 3. Social members may play on weekends after 2 PM.
- 4. Social members may not play in any tournaments or events listed on the Club's tournament schedule.
- 5. Social members are eligible to play as a guest only in member-guest events.
- 6. Social members may participate in Couples golf. Note that this would count as one round (2 nine-hole rounds).
- 7. Social members' use of any practice facilities may only occur prior to the above described rounds of golf.
- 8. Being as social members are not golf members, golf guests are not permitted.
