Out of the Rough

It's hard to believe August is upon us. Let's talk about what is coming up this month and what to expect in terms of course conditions.

Recently we have received several compliments via email and face to face interaction out on the course. I appreciate the positive feedback and would like to thank our staff for their hard work. It's always a big team effort but I want to give a special thank you to our full time staff: Steve Albo (Equipment Manager), Michael Burrows (Assistant Superintendent), Alex Koldys (House Maintenance), Jimbo Hicks (Setup Specialist, Asst. Equipment Manager) and Equipment Operators Mario Vasquez, Alvaro Pauc, Mauricio Morales and Jose Figueroa. These guys have been with us for several years and we wouldn't be successful without their dedication.



Out of the Rough

Growth Regulators will be applied to short cut turf and some areas of the rough. This can often give the turf a slightly bronze tint but it's usually short lived if present at all. We want to slow the top growth of the plant down to help reduce clippings and reduce our mowing frequency. Aerification- Fall Aerification is scheduled for September 5th. In the event of poor weather, those procedures will be postponed until October 9th. On August 7th, we will perform a simple and

procedures will be postponed until October 9th. On August 7th, we will perform a simple and routine ¹/₄" hollow tine venting procedure. This will ensure good soil oxygen levels and proper drainage until they can be aerified in September or October.

Heights of Cut-Heights of cut are being raised this time of year. This will have a noticeable impact on ball roll out distance in the fairway and approach areas of the course. We do this for several reasons. When turf is mowed at or below 1/2" it must be cut very frequently. As reflected in our budget, we lose our part time summer labor as school starts back so it becomes very difficult or even impossible to cut fairways daily. Raising the height allows them to be cut in a healthy manor about 2 times per week. As the days get shorter there is less time available for the plant to go through the process of photosynthesis and produce energy. A longer leaf blade ensures the turf is able to gather as much sunlight as possible. Lastly, we want to enter the dormancy period with a thick canopy of turf. This extends our root development, prevents erosion, enhances traffic tolerance and insulates

Fairways will be slit aerified in the coming weeks. This process is relatively simply, relieves compaction and promotes root growth.
