
Out of the Rough

It's February already? Winter seems to be flying by! We've had our share of weather delays lately but the team continues to make progress with several projects. Here is an update on what we have been focusing on while not prepping the course for daily play.

New tee markers are being made in-house on rainy days. These new tee markers are essentially the same as we have made in the past but this year we are making them out of Maple. The idea is that these will last longer since there is no rough bark that has a tendency to fall off throughout the course of the season. Making these in-house saves us several hundred dollars each year.



On those weather delays... We received right at 6.00" of rain in January. That's exactly 1.00" above average. Given that the National Drought Monitor still has us listed in Severe Drought, we'll take it! I expect the map to change drastically by the end of February, but for now this is what our area's drought situation looks like.





The mound along the 9th is progressing well. In spite of some weather delays, we were able to make a great deal of progress the last few days of January. Once we get all the material in place we will seed the mound with Fine Fescue that will hold up well in drought and shade.

The last subject I want to touch on is weed control. Given the amount of stress our turf took during the 2016 Drought, we did not treat most of our short grass areas with a preemerge herbicide last fall. This was the safe option, as preemerge herbicides are not labeled for use on turf that has a root system weakened by drought. When the rains fell in December we had a significant amount of Poa germinate in fairways and approaches. Now that the course has dried out enough for traffic, we have been spraying these areas with a post emergent herbicide. The mild forecast should be very beneficial and help us maximize our control. Though the Poa is unsightly this time of year we should be much better off in the spring and experience less damage to our fairway turf.
