


# Out of the Rough

# Out of the Rough

May has arrived with torrential rain. We totaled 9.42" rain in April which was about 5.5" above average. Year to date we are approximately 8.4" above average on rainfall. At this point it appears we have reversed the trend of last year's drought. Though still considered a little dry, the pictures below show just how much ground we've made up since November 2016.

The golf course has greened up nicely and we've found ourselves in mid-season form during the month of April. While this is a blessing and very welcome, it has had its difficulties. We are staffed at winter levels until mid-May when school lets out. The need for frequent mowing, weedeating and other routine assignments has come much earlier this year. Throw in storm damage with some regularity and we've at times, fallen behind on our chores. I can see the light at the end of the tunnel though as we will double the size of our crew here in the next couple of weeks.

It appears the biggest carry over from last year's drought has been some turf loss surrounding our bunkers. The soil in these areas is very sandy. This is a result of 20 years of sand blowing and splashing out of the bunkers. Where possible, the team has begun edging the damage turf out. Other areas may require some sod to fully repair the damage. Looking back to last fall, if you had told me this would be the extent of our damage I would have gladly accepted it! The picture shows the team in action beginning to repair some of these damaged areas.
