Out of the Rough

Cool weather has finally arrived! Warm season turfgrass growth is slowing down and the team is beginning to transition to project work. The course remains very dry and unfortunately October is historically our driest month. Let's hope for some much needed rain. Below are a few things we will be focused on before we have to turn our full attention to leaf collection.

- •We have a few trees around the course that didn't fare too well in the drought. Those will be removed as soon as possible.
- •Several irrigation repairs are necessary. Most notably on the 4th, 5th, 12th and 18th.
- •Several areas of the rough will be seeded with ryegrass. This will not take place until the forecast looks somewhat moist for a week straight as most of our rough is not irrigated.
- •The range tees will be overseeded with ryegrass the week of October 3rd. During this time practice will be restricted to mats only.
- •In the 3rd week of October we will address the dead Leyland Cypress along Timberlinks.

This summer was certainly one for the record books. Chattanooga set a record for days over 90 degrees, set many records for hottest individual days and have been in Extreme Drought status for the majority of the growing season. This is serious weather and it comes with consequences. You may recall the summer of 2010 being miserable for all courses in the Chattanooga area. It even forced a few closures. The summer of 2010 was only 1/2 degree warmer than 2016. Given that and looking back now at 2016, I have to say I've been very pleased with the conditions of the course when considering the hand Mother Nature dealt us. Thanks for all the support I've received from so many of you this season.

As a reminder, when leaf season starts it consumes almost every minute of our teams labor. Please be patient during this time as it usually takes us about 8-10 weeks to fully collect and remove fall's glory from the golf course. The picture below is an indication of what we are often faced with each fall morning.
