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Out of the Rough

The bad news is autumn doesn't come until the 22nd day of the month. The good news is September 1st marks the start of meteorological fall. It's been a long, hot, dry summer so I'm going with the meteorological calendar on this one. I'm ready for the all the wonderful things that accompany fall; cooler soil temperatures, lower humidity, football and even a little time away from the golf course.

Our golf schedule called for an early aerification this year. Had I waited any longer we ran the risk of creating the following scenarios:

- (1) Playing the Malarkey Cup and St. Charles Cup on aerified greens
- (2) Aerifying on the 1st available date after those events (10/10/16) and risking not getting the greens healed before winter
 - (3) Being forced into using less aggressive procedures and settling on a process that would be less beneficial to the health of our greens

Given those options I chose to aerify the greens on August 15th. While this is a bit early for us it is actually the preferred time of year for many clubs. The process went off without a hitch as we were able to be very aggressive with our removal process. We used 5/8" tines on the most aggressive setting. This equates to roughly a 13% surface area disruption. Combined with other aerification procedures throughout the year we exceed USGA recommendations. We also test our greens annually for several properties and this aerification procedure was well within the recommendations of that test. With temperatures in the mid-90s we decided not to get too carried away with sand as that is the part than can be most damaging. We did however get a number of the holes filled and were able to topdress quite heavily in the days following the cleanup procedures



This summer's extreme drought has taken its toll on several Leyland Cypress around the course. These areas are being evaluated and a plan will be put in place to address areas where removal is necessary.


Summer is coming to an end and the upcoming weather looks to be fantastic. I hope to see several of you enjoying the wonderful Fall weather on the mountain.
