Course Report April 2018

Wet weather has been the story as we move into April but that shouldn't come as much of a surprise. We typically receive about of 16" of rain between February and May. This always slows production for the Turf Team but I'm happy to say we have made the most of our weather.

Greens have been aerified and topdressed heavily. This gives us a leg up on the weather and allows us to take advantage of any growing days we receive in the spring. The goal is to minimize disruption to putting surfaces as the weather improves and we dust off our clubs for the summer.

Wet conditions have afforded us the time to take on a couple of projects we've had on the backburner. The restroom on the 7th is getting a makeover as the picture below indicates. Staff member Jimbo Hicks has painted a gorgeous logo on the wall and we have removed the old stepping stones leading into the restrooms. New mountain stone pathways will be installed by the first week or two of April.





Additionally, the new chipping area at the practice green has been sodded. This area includes both Bermuda and Zoysia grass to chip from. While just a simple chipping area, it will include a variety of lies found around our greens and provide both rough and shortgrass to practice chipping from. Markers honoring Malarkey and Kistler that were previously located in the old plant bed will be displayed in mountain stone underneath the flagpole.

As the ground firms up we will be able to prep a few areas for sod. These areas include the new 16th tee, old bunker on the 8th and the mound work right of the 7th. Given the location of these areas, we simply haven't had the conditions we need to finish these two projects.
