### Out of the Rough

### Course Report May 2018

March and April weather was depressing. The arrival of May is exciting and I can't wait for the course to green up. Warmer weather is on the doorstep so let's keep our chins up and look forward to the next 3 to 4 months!

A series of heavy rain events began to wash away our foot bridge to the range tees. With the help of our new Bobcat, we were able to pick the bridge up, install a new support structure and then lower the bridge back into place. This saved us a tremendous amount of labor and materials since we didn't have to rebuild the bridge. We will install a new stone walkway on the tee side of the bridge as labor is available this spring.

We are now cutting all playing surfaces with some regularity. As the days lengthen and soil temperatures rise we will begin to use nearly all of our labor hours to keep the golf course mowed and set up for play. It's during this time (May-August) that any non-essential assignments get pushed down the priority list. I ask for your patience with any project work as we aren't budgeted for much more than routine maintenance in the summer months.

As traffic on the course picks up, please be considerate of the Club's Cart Rules. The policy states that carts may not be driven within 30 yards of greens and greenside bunkers. This policy is in place to help sustain healthy turf and reduce the need for expensive fertilizers, chemicals and replacement sod. Following these rules also reduces our need for unsightly ropes and signage. Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in cart violations and as a result we will be using ropes and signs more liberally this year. Perhaps these new measures can be temporary once everyone gets the hang of where we should and shouldn't drive golf carts. Lastly, please do not drive carts in tall grass areas. We keep these areas for a variety of reasons which include wildlife habitat. Birds use the areas for nesting and cart traffic will drive them away.
