Out of the Rough

Thunderstorms have been the norm this July. The results have caused some delays, some closures and as you'll see in the pictures below, some minor turf loss. Let's hope for a drier August and some much improved weather.

When greens puddle the turf begins to suffocate. When conditions like this rear their ugly head we are unable to mow or roll greens as it can cause serious injury to the turf. We have been very proactive this year in terms of keeping our greens vented. This has allowed for improved drainage, increased oxygen levels in the soil and at times, helped us dry up the surface. Even with all the venting we have done, we've seen a little bit of turf decline.

Our greens are in fantastic condition although a bit slower than we would like. I thought you might enjoy seeing these before and after pictures of the 7th green. They show what damage can occur from an afternoon thunderstorm this time of year.





Aerification is scheduled for August 20th. That is a sensitive time of year for bentgrass putting surfaces so if the weather is a bit too severe we will push the procedures back unit after the close of the Tournament Schedule.

Thanks to all of those who helped make the 2018 Mountaineer a great event and if you get the opportunity please thank my staff for all their efforts this year. They really have done an awesome job!


