

The fall season looks to have arrived and the recent weather has been wonderful. The golf course is in great condition. The greens are perfect after the early aerification. We hope to see you all using the golf course as much as possible over these next few great weather months.

Parent-Child

We have rescheduled the Parent/Grandparent-Child Golf Tournament for Sunday, October 15th. The event will be a 9-hole Stroke Play competition. Teams will be compete in a Select Shot/Alternate Shot format. Teams will play a select-shot format until they reach the green. Once on the green they will alternate putting until the ball is holed. Age groups will be 10 and under, 11-13, and 14 and up. Cost of the event is \$20 for the team. Ages 10 and under will play from fairway tees, 11-13 will play from the blue tees while 14 and up will compete from the white tees. Adult males will play from the white tees while adult females will compete from the blue tees.

Short Game Facility Etiquette

As the weather cools and the grass shuts down its growing season, it is incredibly important to take care of our resources. The short game area at the range tends to take a beating throughout the year. Please do your part to take care of this area. Please do not take range balls up to the short game green. Please use personal golf balls to chip as it will give you the most realistic performance to what you will encounter on the course. Please also take the time to clean off the green after chipping. We are right in the middle of my favorite time of year. I would have liked to have had some more rain but September has been absolutely beautiful fall generally provides some of some of the best playing conditions. This fall has started off even drier than last year, I believe the droughty conditions contributed to some of our winter damage during our spring transition. We are making adjustments to keep the turf healthy going into winter including increasing our use of soil wetting agents and running plenty of irrigation, we are in for some big water bills this fall. My favorite thing about this cool, dry weather is how easily we can get the greens firm and fast.

Our department has been understaffed over the last two months but fortunately we have added some new faces that I am excited about. During this period when we have a little lull between mowing season and leaf season we are busy preparing the golf course for the next 6 or 7 months with wall to wall pre-emergent applications and preventative fungicide treatments for Spring Dead Spot in the fairways. Much of what we do during transition times of the year are not to the immediate benefit to the golf course.

The course has not been as busy as I would have thought in September considering the weather and conditions, I hope to see y'all on the course in October.
