

Putts From The Fringe

A common question that I get from members, neighbors, in-laws (everyone that I know who doesn't work at a golf course) is "So what do you guys do in the winter?" Meteorologists will define the dates of astronomical winter and meteorological winter, when answering the "what do we do all winter" question I am talking about "work winter". November is a very busy month for us so work winter falls between the end of leaf season usually in early December and aeration which will be on February 26th. Within that period of about 12 weeks we have Christmas, New Year's, two more wall to wall herbicide applications, tree work cleanup, lots of rain and the flu. Now the four and a half months that feels like winter starts looking more like six good working weeks with a full staff. Despite never getting as much done as I would like, this time of year has been productive and impacted the golf course in positive ways.


Over the last two winters we have completed projects like

- "Lake James" project-draining the lake that formed in 1 fairway every time it rained
- Cleaning and repairing the green's internal drainage system
- Drainage projects on 8,11,12,13 and 15
- Pulling irrigation communication wire to heads that were no communicating
- Auditing the green's and green surround irrigation heads
- Numerous irrigation repairs from replacing valves to catching up on weeping heads
- Plenty of tree work and managing the material in our dump area left of 6.

This year we will continue to work on drainage on 2,4, and 16. We plan to expand some rock work around cart path edges where carts tend to pull off and we have plenty to do around the shop to get this place more functional and less of an eye sore from the golf course.

A few weeks ago I told my wife that I would take a few days here and there during the winter to do some projects around the house, when I asked why she chuckled she told me, "You say that every year and by March are complaining that you didn't get enough done over the winter". She is probably right, my new response to the question about what we do all winter will probably be something along the lines of "about half as much as I'd like". This is not a complaint, biting off more than I can chew is preferable to sitting around tossing cards into a hat.

Thank you for reading and for your interest in the department, I apologize that succinct accounts of golf course operations without the use of run on sentences is not a strength of mine. I look forward to seeing you on the golf course!
