Putts From The Fringe

April is always a tough transition month on the golf course, you look out at the fairways you see green but when stand in the fairway and look down you see that we still have a ways to go. The cool dry air is great for getting the green's roots to dive deep and roll fast but has me begging the bermuda to start growing. This winter was easier on us than last year, but we will have some sod work to do around a few greens. I get discouraged seeing a lot of the same areas struggle every year but most of the sod we have used over the last couple of years has survived and is proof that if we can get the right grass in the right places, we can get this place covered in good playable turf. Our winter issues this year come from areas that have stayed too wet and damage from sledding. I am seeing delayed green up in patterns that resemble surface drainage, these areas that stay wet all winter are not great candidates for warm seasons grasses like bermuda and zoysia. #2 and #4 we will be sprigging using the bermuda fom 9 fairway that is a different variety than the rest of the course. We used 9 fairway as a source for sprigs last year and it worked very well in front of number 8 green. During our cold stretch this winter, I was happy to have a good layer of snow to insulate the grass. It seems that areas that had heavy traffic during the snow cover were damaged, either from removing the snow and insulation of by directly damaging plants that were frozen. This is not something I have seen before at Signal but I stopped being surprised about what this climate can throw at me a while ago. I don't think I have ever been satisfied with a warm season golf course in April, all things considered I think where we usually are.


