Putts From The Fringe

As we step into November, we're enjoying a slightly warmer start to the month, which hopefully means more opportunities for enjoyable rounds of golf before winter arrives. The leaves are finally beginning to fall, and we're taking extra care with our leaf cleanup to minimize traffic on the course.

Courses throughout the region are recognizing the impact of increased cart traffic, especially with the increase in winter play post COVID and the challenges of back to back harsh winters. Managing this traffic is essential for the health of our bermudagrass and its survival through the winter months.

To help protect our turf, please adhere to the 90-degree rule: exit the fairway to the cart path before getting within 30 yards of bunkers. This means navigating to your ball while minimizing traffic on the grass.

Here are some shortcuts to avoid for the health of our course:

- Avoiding Curves: When the cart path curves around the fairway, resist the urge to drive straight to your ball, especially on holes like 6, 9, 10, 12, and 18.
- Bypassing Greens: Please refrain from driving around the back or side of greens, such as on holes 6, 9, and 11, even if it seems closer.
- Stay on the Path: Keep all four tires on the cart path in pinch points, particularly around tee boxes and green complexes.

We believe that with everyone's cooperation, we can navigate the course in a mindful way that protects our greens and fairways as we move into spring.

On another note, our irrigation project is set to start this month, and we don't anticipate any hole closures until after Thanksgiving. However, the sewage lining project may involve closing hole 13 or temporarily playing it as a par 3 during the first or second week of November. We appreciate your patience as the utility team gets their work done.
