2025 Haskew Cup Can the Good Guys Make it Four in a Row?

Since 2003, the male golfers of SMGCC and Black Creek Club in Chattanooga have contested the annual Haskew Cup, a two-day Ryder Cup-style tournament that is one of the highlights of our club's golf calendar. This year's tournament - the 20th - will be hosted by Black Creek on October 4th-5th, as Signal will be looking to extend our winning streak to an unprecedented fourth consecutive victory in the event.

Our team will be comprised of 31 members who will qualify for the team over the next few months, plus our club's head professional Billy Winters. There are three different times when members can post scores to be used for Haskew Cup qualifying – on three specific qualifying days during the summer, during this month's Signal Mountain Invitational, and during next month's Club Championship. Each member's qualifying score will be their two best scores from these different events.

The tournament was created by our club's Wayne Palmer and his friend Gary Haskew, who was a longtime member of Black Creek. Wayne has served as Signal's captain for many years and has an obvious love for the event. He said, "It is exciting that over 20 years after Gary and I first created this tournament, the passion is still there for both clubs to continue to grow friendships while competing in tournament golf."

The rivalry between the two teams is friendly, and the results have been very even over the 19 times the tournament has been played. Both teams have won the event nine teams – thanks to Signal's recent hot streak, winning four of the last five and the last three in a row.

The two clubs have a differing of opinions on the 2017 edition. Black Creek was leading after the first day, but torrential rains on Sunday forced a cancellation of the event. Black Creek claims that year as their 10th victory, while Signal views it as a rain out. (There also have been three years since 2003 when the tournament was not held.) The home team has won all but three of the tournaments, with our team winning for the first time at Black Creek in 2023.

The tournament includes three rounds of match play formats. After a Friday night cocktail party and dinner at the host club, Saturday features two-man team matches with Four-ball in the morning and Foursomes (alternate shot) in the afternoon, followed by Singles matches on Sunday.

The team will include players of a variety of handicap levels, from scratch players to those with 12+ handicaps, along with several slots for senior players. Last year, a club-record 57 members tried to qualify, a sign of how popular this event has become over the years.

Be on the lookout for more information about this year's qualifying process (to be e-mailed soon), and keep in mind that the first chance to start posting qualifying scores is the Signal Mountain Invitational, to be played May 16-18.

Putts From The Fringe

Our irrigation project is finally wrapped up, which means we can now put all our energy into getting the golf course in the best shape possible. This project pulled resources away from our regular operations and slowed short-term progress, and as a result, the attention to detail around the course has been lacking. It will take us some time to catch up and recover. This golf course is like a pitcher coming out of Tommy John surgery, we aren't quite ready to throw 100 mph yet.

That said, I'm encouraged by the green up in the fairways. Even with the scars left behind from construction, we're ahead of schedule when it comes to color and turf density. We haven't been able to settle into a regular mowing routine due to rocks in the fairway and rain, but by the first week of May, we should have the chance to mow the course wall to wall multiple times. This will improve the overall presentation significantly.

Unfortunately, our irrigation contractor will need to return for repairs to some greens drainage that was damaged during the project. Poor drainage in certain areas has led to algae growth, which we'll have to fight to eliminate before summer. This is all part of the process, I would have been shocked if we didn't have to bring the crew back for some adjustments.

I expect to see continued improvements in the golf course every week through May and June, and I'm excited to see how much we can achieve with this new system, not just because of improved irrigation coverage and control but also because we'll experience fewer interruptions due to leaks.

Thank you all for your patience throughout the winter and spring. We had to take a step back to install this system, we are now starting our two steps forward at full speed.
